FAITH CORNER

THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP

Following Jesus can be costly.

This story of the sacrifice of Isaac is a powerful symbol for Christians. At times we, too, find that God seems to be making terrible demands of us. A child or a loved one dies from illness or an accident, or our life-plans are changed dramatically by outside events. The story about Abraham and Isaac can help us see that what is happening in our lives is not God's punishment or a sign of God's anger. The sacrifice God wants from us is an inner one, a kind of "sacrificial obedience," rather than for us to become permanently bitter over the loss of the child or the change in life's plans. We remember that God did give God's Son as a sacrifice for us. Jesus' sacrifice was a sacrifice of love and obedience to God. It was a sacrifice that cost him suffering and death. Because of this, he transformed sacrifice. The forgiving love shown by the Son of God on the cross reveals to us that our God is a God of redeeming love. As Christians, we imitate Jesus' forgiving love and join ourselves to Jesus' sacrifice of obedient and forgiving compassion.

Living in His spirit, therefore, Christians are to deny themselves, take up the cross each day, and follow in His steps. (#99, see also #43)

Catechism of the Catholic Church

For a moment Jesus discloses his divine glory, confirming Peter's confession. He also reveals that he will have to go by the way of the cross at Jerusalem in order to "enter into his glory." Moses and Elijah had seen God's glory on the Mountain; the Law and the Prophets had announced the Messiah's sufferings. Christ's Passion is the will of the Father: the Son acts as God's servant; the cloud indicates the presence of the Holy Spirit. "The whole Trinity appeared: the Father in the voice; the Son in the man; the Spirit in the shining cloud."

You were transfigured on the mountain, and your disciples, as much as they were capable of it, beheld your glory, O Christ our God, so that when they should see you crucified they would understand that your Passion was voluntary, and proclaim to the world that you truly are the splendor of the Father. From the beginning, Jesus associated his disciples with his own life, revealed the mystery of the Kingdom to them, and gave them a share in his mission, joy, and sufferings. Jesus spoke of a still more intimate communion between him and those who would follow him: "Abide in me, and I in you....I am the vine you are the branches." And he proclaimed a mysterious and real communion between his own body and ours: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." (#787)

What is it?

-- The Cursillo Movement is a movement of the Church that has the same apostolic purpose as the Church herself. And the Church, as Pope Paul VI told us, exists to evangelize."

-- The purpose (or goal) of the Movement is to make Christian community possible in neighborhoods, parishes, work situations and other places where people live the greater part of their lives.

-- It helps people discover and fulfill their personal vocations and makes it possible for anyone in the world to live a Christian life in a natural way, "the leavening of environments with the Gospel." Changing the places we spend time by being Christlike in our thoughts, words, and actions.

Requirements to attend a Cursillo weekend:

1. Be a Catholic in good standing.
